DIOCESAN YEAR OF PRAYER AND VOCATION

September is a month of prayer before the Eucharist. The saints to accompany us this month span 800 years. St Thomas Aquinas was an Italian Dominican friar, a renowned teacher, philosopher and preacher. He died in 1274. His hymns of adoration before the Eucharist are still sung today. Blessed Oscar Romero of El Salvador was martyred celebrating Mass in his cathedral in 1980. He will be canonised next month. He drew great strength from the Mass which gave him the courage to be active in his opposition to the political and social oppression of his people.

This month it is suggested we take time to sit quietly on our own before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle or join our parish at a Eucharistic devotion such as Adoration or Benediction. You might just sit or kneel in silence and in your heart acknowledge with thanksgiving and adoration the great mystery and gift of the presence of God.
