The saint to accompany us in April is **St Frances of Rome.**

St Frances was married for forty years but her husband was away for much of the time in intercity wars and she became a single parent. She took responsibility for running the family estates. Additional tragedy came when two sons died of the plague. She opened her own house to the poor and sick and led other wealthy ladies of Rome in prayer and nursing the needy. We are asked this month to set aside time to pray at the beginning and end of the day.

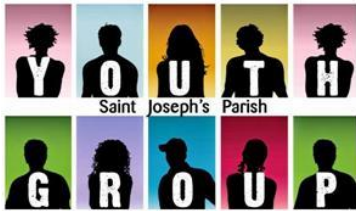
FEAST DAY - 1 MAY ST JOSEPH THE WORKER
